#### Regional Children's Services Plans

Funding of \$3.06 million was allocated to develop 'Regional Children's Services Plans' in the nine Regional Development Commission areas of WA. With the intention that each plan will be developed in a localised context, including population forecasts, community economic and workforce profiles. To provide a regional framework and recommendations to achieve a more strategic and co-ordinated approach to the development of services that support families and children in regional WA. The project is proposed to take two years and delivered in two phases, development and implementation.

The plans will also provide an opportunity to strengthen and or improve the level and quality of existing education and care services. Once completed, each regional plan will be used to inform the development of a state-wide Regional Education and Care Services Plan. RDA Wheatbelt is developing the Wheatbelt plan.

## Budget Based Funded Quality Measure - Workforce Element (Child Care Services Training Projects)

The workforce element of the Budget Based Funded (BBF) Quality Measure will support centre-based BBF child care services to meet the staffing arrangement requirements of the National Quality Standard. These requirements include child care educators being qualified at the Certificate III or Diploma level.

## Early Years Quality Fund

The Early Years Quality Fund will provide funding directly to eligible services over two years to supplement wage increases for Certificate III qualified educators, with proportional increases across the classification scale.

## HECS-HELP Benefit for Early Childhood Education Teachers

The Australian Government has provided funding to reduce by about half the Higher Education Loan Program (HELP) debt of early childhood teachers who work in regional and remote areas, Indigenous communities and areas of high disadvantage based on postcode location. To further encourage and support early childhood teachers working in these areas, the Government has expanded the scope of the Guidelines so more early childhood education teachers are eligible to apply for the benefit. The HECS-HELP benefit will be discontinued from 1 July 2015. Eligible graduates will have until 30 June 2017 to claim the HECS-HELP benefit for work undertaken for the 2014-15 income year.

#### **HECS-HELP Benefit for Education Graduates**

In addition to the HECS-HELP benefit for Early Childhood Education Teachers working in remote areas, early childhood teachers (working in any Australian location) may also be eligible for a reduction of their HECS-HELP debt under the 'HECS-HELP Benefit for education and nursing/midwifery graduates' which was introduced to encourage students to undertake education and nursing qualifications.

## Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) for early childhood professionals

The RPL initiative provides \$9.2 million over 4 years to support the implementation of the National Quality Framework by providing an opportunity for existing early childhood educators located in regional and remote locations, who lack formal qualifications, to have their skills recognised through an RPL assessment. The initiative will make it easier for experienced early childhood educators to obtain or upgrade their qualifications using new national RPL assessment tools for Cert III, Dip and Adv Dip in Children's Services.

#### **Child Care Benefit**

Helps cover the cost of child care, including long day care, family day care, occasional day care, outside school hours care, vacation care, pre-school, and kindergarten. It may also help cover the cost of child care provided by grandparents, relatives, friends or nannies. The online Child Care Online Estimator lets you make informed decisions and estimate child care entitlements that you may be able to receive. Based on your circumstances, you can estimate a dollar amount for Child Care Benefit for approved child care, Child Care Rebate entitlements, and out-of-pocket child care costs. #### **Child Care Rebate**

Paid in addition to Child Care Benefit and covers 50 per cent of out-of-pocket child care expenses, up to a maximum amount per child per year. To receive Child Care Rebate you must first claim Child Care Benefit for approved child care and be eligible for that payment (even at the zero rate). Child Care Benefit is based on your income and is different for everyone. You do not need to lodge a claim for Child Care Rebate. You will automatically be assessed when you claim Child Care Benefit for approved child care. The rebate is then paid to you if you are eligible for Child Care Benefit for approved child care and you meet the Child Care Rebate 'work, training, study test' (or are exempt from it).

#### Child Care Worker (WA) Job Guide

To become a child care worker you usually have to complete a VET qualification in children's services or out of school hours care. Applicants may be required to attend an interview. As subjects and prerequisites can vary between institutions, you should contact your chosen institution for further information. You may be able to study through distance education. You can also become a child care worker through an apprenticeship or traineeship in Children's Services or Outside School Hours Care. Entry requirements may vary but employers usually require Year 10. Ask your career adviser about the possibility of starting some of this training in school.

Child Wise @ Child\_Wise

Any person who believes, on reasonable grounds, that a child is in need of protection may voluntarily report to Child Protection Services.

- You do not have to prove that abuse has taken place. You only need reasonable grounds for your belief.
- You do not need permission from parents or caregivers to make a report; nor do they need to be informed that a report is being made.
- If you made a report in good faith, you cannot be held legally liable regardless of the outcome of the report.
- Your identity will remain confidential unless you need to give evidence if the matter goes to court. It is rare that this happens.

Children's Contact Services (CCS) aim to minimise a child's exposure to conflict or unsafe situations when parents are separating or have separated. CCS also work with families to encourage positive interaction between children and their parents and to support the strengthening of these relationships. Over time, and where possible and safe to do so, parents are encouraged to move to self-management of their arrangements for spending time with the child.

#### **Foster Care**

The Dept of Child Protection provides care for children from birth to 18 yo, for emergency, respite, short, medium and long term care. Respite Program - Respite Carers look after children for short periods of time to give their full time carers a break. They look after children in their own home for a few hours, a weekend or a few weeks. They undertake the same training, assessment and approval process as general foster carers. Home 4 Life is another way of describing 'permanent foster caring' - where a child is placed permanently with the same foster carer until the child turns 18. To become a long term, permanent foster carer or Home 4 Life carer, you need to apply and be assessed by the Department's Fostering and Adoption Services. Long term foster care may lead to a Special Guardianship Order or a Carer Adoption - both provide a child with a home for life. Pre-Adoptive Foster Care - Mainly for newborn babies while the birth parents are considering long-term care options. The period of care ranges from a few days to several months. You need to have had experience caring for a newborn baby, and the main caregiver cannot be in paid employment.

Private and community based centres are run by qualified staff and are usually open Monday to Friday. All centres must be licensed and are carefully regulated in Western Australia, with strict rules on: the number of children in attendance; running and maintaining centres and; the quality of care and food provided. You will need to arrange enrolment directly with the child care centre. Waiting lists are common due to high demand, so it is important to register as soon as possible. For a listing of Western Australia's child care centres, visit the My Child website. Family day care is care available for children aged from six weeks in their own home. The carers must have a qualification in child care and need to be licensed like child care centres. They must be trained in first aid and have undergone the 'Working with Children' check and have a 'National Police Clearance' check. A maximum of four pre-school age children can be cared for at one time. This service is coordinated by local councils, or private organisations that monitor the quality of care provided.

CRC's also offer a range of services including access to - Centrelink, Medicare and child support agents, WA government information booths, video conferencing and numerous other services that can help network families with agencies. Many CRC's in conjunction with their local libraries also provide the family literacy program, Better Beginnings.

# What types of care are available?

Family Day Care and Child Care Centres – Provide child care primarily for babies, toddlers and children prior to commencing school. Some may also offer places for primary school age children.

Outside school hours care centres and outside school hours family day care – Provide child care for school-age children from kindergarten age. Some services offer places for children up to the age of 15 years and six months.

Crèches, in-home care, nannies and babysitters – These child care centres are not licensed. However operators have a duty of care to ensure children are safe and well cared for.
