

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1976.

The Municipality of the Shire of Wyalkatchem.

By-Laws Relating to the Management and Control of the Wyalkatchem Recreation Centre (Reserve No. 15004).

L.G. WY-7-11.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 21st day of October, 1976, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-Laws:—

1. The By-Laws for the Management and Regulation of the Wyalkatchem Recreation Ground and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th day of March, 1931, are hereby repealed.
2. In these By-Laws—
 - “Council” means the Wyalkatchem Shire Council.
 - “Centre” means the Wyalkatchem Recreation Centre.
 - “Shire Clerk” shall mean the Shire Clerk of the Shire of Wyalkatchem.
 - “Inspector” shall mean and include any Inspector, Health and/or Building Surveyor or any other Officer or Servant of the Council appointed to assist in maintaining a due observation of the By-Laws of the Shire of Wyalkatchem.
3. The Council may set aside for the exclusive use of any sporting club, organisation, body or individual person any part of the Centre or buildings thereon.
4. No person shall destroy, damage or interfere with any tree, shrub, flower, plant, fence, building, seat, water pipe, hose, hose fitting, reticulation spray line, soil, grass, surface, or other property, including plant and machinery, owned by or vested in the Council.
5. No person shall climb or be upon any tree shrub, wall, fence or the roof of any building.
6. No person shall deposit or leave any litter or refuse on the ground or in any building established on the Centre, except in the receptacles provided.
7. No person shall light any fire within the Centre except in an area set aside for the purpose without the written permission of the Shire Clerk and/or an Inspector.
8. No person shall write upon or deface any building or other fixtures on the Centre.
9. No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of the Shire Clerk or any Inspector, Officer or Servant of the Council.
10. No person shall expectorate on the paths, seats, walls and floors of any buildings on the Centre.
11. No person shall camp, lodge or tarry over night on the Centre or in any of the buildings without the permission of the Council.
12. No person or organised club, having obtained permission, shall practice or play at any such game, except at such times and upon such portions of the Centre and/or Oval as shall be specified in such permission.
13. It shall be lawful for any Officer, Inspector or Servant of the Council or any member of the Police Force to remove from the Centre any child under the age of 6 years who is not under the control or in the care of a parent of such child or other person over the age of 18 years.
14. No person shall suffer or allow any dog to enter or remain on any part of the Centre unless on a leash held by the owner or the custodian of the dog.
15. No person shall commit a nuisance in any building or on any part of the Centre.
16. No person shall fly any kite or model aircraft on the Oval or any other part of the Centre without the permission of the Shire Clerk.
17. It shall be lawful for any Officer, Inspector and/or Servant of the Council, or member of the Police Force, to remove any person who is not entitled to use the Centre or the buildings thereon.
18. No person shall throw stones or cause missiles to be projected on any part of the Centre and it shall be unlawful for any ball games to be played in or near any buildings on the Centre, or on any part of the Centre which has not been set aside for the playing of such ball games.
19. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance or use any foul or indecent language, or commit any act of indecency.
20. No person shall drive or ride any motor vehicle on the Oval or Trotting Track except with the approval of an Officer, Inspector and/or Servant of the Council.
21. No person shall enter any pavilion, dressing or training room or use any facility which has been set aside by the Council for the exclusive use of any sporting club, organisation or body unless authorised to do so.
22. No alcoholic or spirituous liquors shall be consumed in any building or on any part of the Centre unless written permission has first been obtained from the Council, and it shall be unlawful for any sporting club, organisation or individual person to sell alcoholic or spirituous liquors on the Centre unless a special license or function permit has been obtained from the appropriate Authority.

23. No person shall drive a motor car, truck, utility or ride a motor cycle on any part of the Recreation Centre where vehicular traffic is permitted at a speed exceeding 20 (twenty) kilometres per hour or in a manner contrary to the Traffic Act and Regulations.

24. Any sporting club, organisation, body or individual person requiring the use of any buildings and facilities on the Centre, for social purposes at a time when the buildings and facilities are not normally used, must make written application to the Council for permission to use such building and facilities.

25. The user of any building and facilities at the Centre shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such building and facilities and shall be solely and entirely responsible for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture and crockery-ware and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Council at the current replacement and/or repair rates or prices.

26. Any Officer, Inspector, member of the Police Force and/or Servant of the Council shall, if required to do so, have free ingress to any building or facility at all times during the term of engagement to ensure that good order and decent behaviour is being maintained.

27. The Council reserves the right, at any time, to cancel any agreement made for the use of the Centre and the buildings thereon.

28. Any sporting club, organisation, body or individual person having used any building and facilities at the Centre shall leave the building and facilities in a clean and tidy condition and the furniture in its normal position.

29. It shall be the responsibility of the sporting club, organisation, body or individual person using the buildings and facilities to ensure that all lights are switched off after use, and the power to electrical appliances turned off.

30. It shall also be the responsibility of the sporting club, organisation, body or individual person to ensure that all doors to the buildings and facilities are locked immediately after use.

31. No person shall wilfully damage, interfere or tamper with any electrical switchboard, electrical wiring, electrical appliance, light or fittings, hot water system, water taps, gas cylinders, cisterns, pedestals, hand basins, mirrors, paper towel and toilet roll dispensers, shower roses or any other fixtures contained in the buildings at the Recreation Centre.

32. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these By-Laws or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$200 (two hundred dollars) for every such conviction.
